- 3. Approval of November 12, 2019 Minutes- M/S Hill/Wallace with changes. Approved unanimously.
- 4. General Business
 - **a.** <u>Chair and Vice Chair Selection</u> –M/S Cahalen/Wallace to for Roy Johnson as chair, Sam Storey as Vice-Chair. Approved unanimously.
 - b. <u>Plein Air</u> Commissioner Hill reported on the Plein Air event. Recommends it continue. Quick Draw should be included again. Sales were down from previous year. Event made some money. Would support the 2020 event at NBMS again. Will do artist survey about the weekend. Will ask for City help with sales tax. Want to use proceeds to fund youth art.  - c. <u>Merchandise</u> Chair Johnson and Commissioner Cahalen volunteered for subcommittee. Staff will see if Commissioner Mozumder is interested. Commissioner Storey asked about Credit Cards at the concerts.
 - d. <u>Battle of the Bands (Verbal)</u> Commissioner Wallace reported they will be meeting next week. Soquel High is not available. 6-8 bands. Would like help in securing donations.
 - e. <u>Monterey Railing (Verbal)</u> Still need to meet. Peter Wilk (in attendance) is on the subcommittee. Will write the scope and call to artists and what the vision is. Will meet 21st of January.
 - f. Esplanade and Park Trash Cans (Verbal) Met with Vicki at BIA. Identified how the vision overlaps. Need to asses can availability and how they are disbursed. Inadequate signage is a BIA concern. It may be just the signage that is public art. April 22nd is the 50th anniversary of Earth Day, maybe art could involve kids. Has asked zero waste store for feedback. Staff will follow up with Big Belly.
 - **g.** <u>**Depot Hill Stairs (Verbal)**</u> Staff and Commissioner Cahalen will work on call to artists. Commissioner Storey wanted to make sure the artists know about the condition of the stairs.

SUBJECT: Capitola Recreation Afterschool Art

BACKGROUND

At the January 14, 2020 Art and Cultural Commission meeting, the Commission recommended the use of \$1000 of the proceeds of the 2019 Plein Air event to help fund a Plein Air painting unit Afterschool recreation club at New Brighton Middle School.
