What a Wharf !

The museum is pleased to announce that we have a new art installation in the Capitola City Council Chambers at City Hall. In January we added the wonderful Capitola Wharf model made by local model maker Chris Lundell.



The wharf model, along with a Capitola trestle model (displayed at Capitola Mall Police Annex), were donated to the museum a couple of years ago by Jeremy and Rhiannon Lundell. Where to display the 10' long wharf model was the first question since it took up valuable space in museum artifact storage. Over the past year, the Museum Board of Trustees looked into various ways to create a display but the cost estimates were higher than they anticipated.

Museum Board President Brian Legakis took the matter into his own hands and volunteered to lovingly make a display table for the model. The entire project, costing approximately \$1,600, was fully funded by museum donations. A timely large donation from Peter Dwares of the Capitola Mercantile was used toward the acquisition of an acrylic top made by Tapp Plastics of San Jose.

The model, which depicts the old wharf in its prime, was previously part of an exhibit at the museum in late 1995 called "*Honey, I Shrunk the Bridge — The Model World of Chris Lundell.*" That exhibit included not only the wharf model, but also Lundell's models of the Seacliff Cement Ship, Capitola Trestle and the Golden Gate Bridge. The wharf model was installed (with a series of historic wharf photographs) by Curator Deborah Osterberg, Board Vice President Roger Wyant, Board Trustee Enrique Dolmo, and Museum Volunteers Dave Peyton and John Karwin.

Highlights from recent artifact acquisitions:

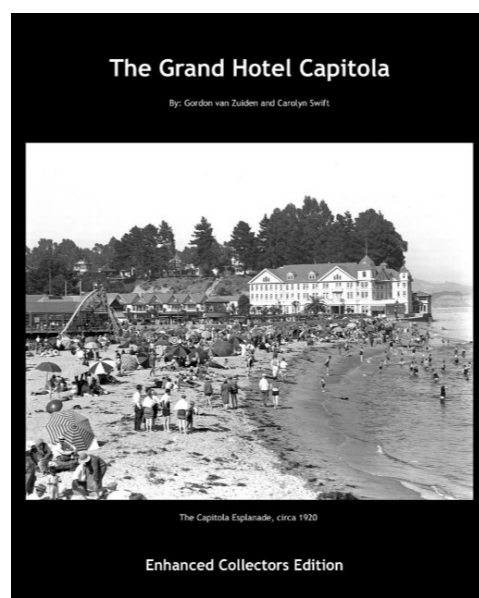
Jay Topping donated a military style, olive green short jacket, jodhpurs, and gaiters which belonged to Otto Jensen of Soquel (from the Lund family)

It's been almost 20 years since they released the first edition of this popular book. In the December 11, 2007 copy of the *Mid-County Post* Jeff Gatlin wrote, *"At the signing by the authors at the museum on December 1, a line of readers snaked out the door, eager to snap up the entire first run of 100 copies."*



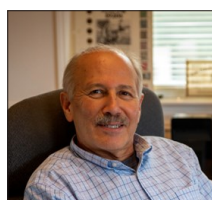

Brian Legakis, President of the Board, Capitola Historical Museum, gave this review of *The Grand Hotel Capitola* book,

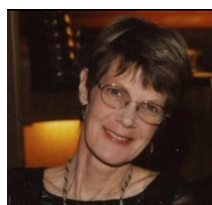

Our community's museum can only operate with the dedicated service of our Museum Volunteers.

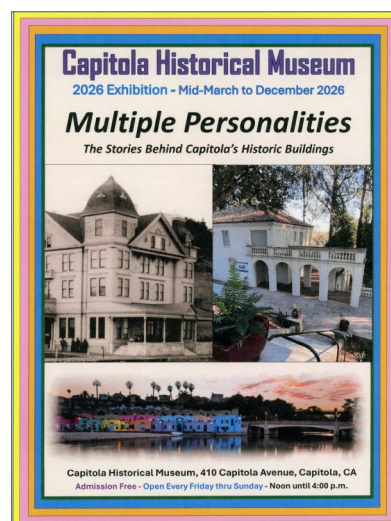
