Dear Mr. Grunow,

Anderson Brulé Architects, Inc. (ABA) is pleased to submit this proposal to assist the City in a Community Workshop focused on working with the community to get their input on the desired character and experience of the future Capitola Library. The outcome of this workshop will be used to inform inspirational graphics (a rendered perspective view and an optional rendered site plan) of the Library that will communicate what was heard from the Community, and be used moving forward as the City considers funding mechanisms.

Scope of Work

The following outlines our proposal for the Capitola Library Expanded Parking Study:

Step 1: Planning Meeting with Library Ad Hoc Subcommittee

- ABA to prepare for and facilitate a planning session with the Library Subcommittee to carefully craft the context, purpose, intended results, and scripted agenda with planned engagement activities for the Community Workshop – targeted date of September 8, 2015 at 3:30 pm
- Follow up phone call/web-teleconference with Staff to finalize details for the Community Workshop

Step 2: Community Workshop

- ABA to prepare for and facilitate, with Staff, a single 3 hour community workshop including development of image character boards for planned exercises
- ABA to document community workshop outcome and share outcome in the form of meeting minutes, scanned flipchart notes, photos, etc.

Step 3: Develop Inspirational Graphics

- ABA to take input received from the community workshop and commence a character design study to develop a design concept as the framework for the rendering
- ABA to prepare a final inspirational perspective color rendering (in watercolor format) of the proposed library
- ABA to review draft wireframes of each graphic with Staff to get input and make revisions
- ABA to finalize graphics based on input from Staff
- ABA to provide a final draft composite of the perspective rendering, rendered site plan (if selected, noted as optional below), and a summary outline of the key programmatic elements of the library
- ABA to finalize any remaining minor adjustments and comments from Staff into the final document
 - Optional: ABA to develop inspirational site plan, color graphic of the proposed library

ABA to attend the educational kick off meeting on the existing library site, celebrating 16
years with the current portable and a focus on looking ahead to the future Library
