# **MANDATORY RECYCLING IN CAPITOLA**

Capitola has adopted a new Business and Multi Family Recycling Ordinance that will assure our entire community is working together to help recycle valuable resources while significantly reducing the amount of waste being sent to landfills. The State of California recently mandated that all businesses which generate four cubic yards or more of commercial solid waste per week, and multifamily residential dwellings with five or more units, are required to recycle. The new regulation goes into effect on July 1, 2012.

The commercial sector generates nearly threefourths of the garbage in California, with much of the waste composed of recyclable materials. The City of Capitola offers recycling to all residents and businesses as a part of their garbage service, there is no additional cost. In fact, as businesses increase their recycling, and reduce their garbage they can actually save money.

The City will conduct education and outreach to inform those impacted by the new laws to provide information about the recycling opportunities that are available within the City. Enforcement will consist of monitoring with the assistance of the City's waste hauler, Green Waste Recovery.

**RECYCLEBANK GREEN CHOICES RECYCLING CHALLENGE** 

The Recyclebank Green Choices Recycling Challenge is a nationwide competition to increase curbside recycling. # **CITY OF CAPITOLA PERMANENT ONE QUARTER PERCENT SALES TAX INCREASE**

The statewide sales tax rate in California is 7 percent. Under state law, California cities receive 1 percent of the state sales tax on taxable transactions that occur within their city limits and the state receives the other 6 percent. In addition city voters in a particular city can approve supplementary sale taxes, the revenue from which is dedicated exclusively to their city. In Santa Cruz County, voters have also approved a County-wide percent sales tax for the Santa Cruz Metropolitan Transit District (Metro) and a percent sales tax for the Santa Cruz County Public Library.

In 2004, City voters approved a temporary percent sales tax increase for Capitola which was originally scheduled to sunset in 2010. In 2008 City voters extended the sunset date to December 31, 2017. As a result of these two voter approvals, and the Metro and Library taxes, the total current sales tax rate in Capitola is 8 percent. This means that while the state continues to receive 6 cents for each taxable dollar spent in the City, the City currently receives 1 cent on each such expenditure.

This ordinance, if adopted by the voters, would increase the sales tax rate by another percent from the current rate of 8 percent to 8 percent. The sales tax increase proposed by this ballot measure has no sunset date. Accordingly if the proposed permanent percent tax increase is approved by the voters, the City's sales tax, also known as the City's retail transactions and use tax, will total 8 percent through December 31, 2017 and 8 percent thereafter.

All City revenue generated by the sales tax is used by the City to pay for general City operations and programs including public safety and street improvements. As such, this ballot measure proposes a "general purpose tax" rather than a "special purpose tax" and requires a simple majority vote for adoption.

### **BACTERIA IN OUR CREEK!**

DON'T FEED THE BIRDS & CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOGS!! That is what a past study conducted by the County of Santa Cruz Environmental Health Services (EHS) found were major contributors to the high levels of bacteria found in Soquel Creek and the Capitola Beach lagoon. Historically, Soquel Creek has experienced high bacteria levels leading to the posting of the lagoon as unsafe for swimming. EHS conducted monitoring of Soquel Creek and tributaries in order to better characterize sources of bacterial contamination in the creek and the lagoon. They found that birds 55%, dogs 13% and rodents 13% were the primary sources of fecal coliform while human contribution was 6%.

Water flows from your neighborhood into the storm drains which flows directly to the creek or ocean. Dog droppings disposed of in streets, drainage channels, or other areas subject to storm runoff ultimately end up in our water ways. It is critical that you clean up after your dog and dispose of the waste properly in garbage cans. Those of you who feed the birds down at the beach or along the creek are significantly are only encouraging the birds to stay around and  $\mathbf{A}^{\bullet}$ are contributing to the high fecal coliform found in the creek and its tributaries.

## **SLURRY SEAL PROJECT COMING FALL 2012**

This fall the City will be completing a slurry seal project that will treat the most of the streets in the Depot Hill, Deanes Lane, Jewel Box (east of 49th Avenue), and Reposa Avenue. Current scheduling calls for the City to receive bids on the project in August and begin work following the Art & Wine festival. All residents on the effected streets will be notified in advance.
