Officer Blankenship received a proclamation recognizing Police Canine Damein for her dedication and service to the citizens of Capitola.

Christine McBroom, Capitola Finance Advisory Committee Chair, provided a recommendation from the Finance Advisory Committee. The recommendation is to increase the City's Emergency Fund from the current 5% of operating expenses to 10%, as well as the contingency reserves from the current 10% to 15%. She presented a graphic projection regarding the City's cash reserves.

# 3. REPORT ON CLOSED SESSION

City Attorney Barisone announced that no reportable action was taken during the special and regular closed session. [520-25]

City Manager Goldstein stated that the City's Accounting Supervisor Lisa Saldana has accepted a position as the Finance Manager for the City of Seaside.

The City received an application from Sandy Erickson to be considered a seat on the City's Financial Advisory Committee. The appointments will be discussed later in the meeting.

City Clerk Sneddon stated that correspondence was received from the County of Santa Cruz that the Board of Supervisors adopted a resolution setting the 2013 tenant security deposit at 0.02%. This is an action item later in the meeting.

Mayor Harlan requested a continuation of various internal appointments to City committees and commissions to the January 3, 2013, City Council meeting to allow additional time for interviews.

Council Member Norton requested that staff provide the City Council with a description of the various City internal committees' and commissions' duties.

Marilyn Garrett, local resident, spoke against wireless radiation.

Maggie Ivy, Santa Cruz County Conference and Visitor's Council CEO/Executive Vice President, stated in order to celebrate the holidays and encourage locals and visitors alike to capture great holiday memories in California's favorite beachside destination, the Santa Cruz County Conference & Visitors Council is

asking the public to upload their best "Holidays in Santa Cruz" pictures to an online photo contest.

#### 6. COUNCIL/STAFF ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mayor Harlan provided an update from a Monterey Bay Unified Air Pollution Control Board meeting where it approved an outlaw burning of yard waste in San Lorenzo Valley. She stated that the Capitola Police Department has a prescription drug collection program. There is a Paint Care Program where the public can take unused paint to Kelly-Moore Pain stores in Santa Cruz and Watsonville, or to the Sherwin-Williams store in Santa Cruz to be disposed of properly. She stated that Save-Our-Shores have reported that up to 80% of customers are bringing in their own reusable bags to shop. The County of Santa Cruz is going to celebrate their one-year anniversary of the elimination of the single-use plastic ordinance. As part of an April Earth Day celebration, free reusable bags will be given out.

Tim Goncharoff, Santa Cruz County Integrated Waste Management Programs Coordinator, stated that the County has been selected as the recipient of the 2012 Governor's Environmental and Economic Leadership Award (GEELA) for waste reduction.

Laura Kasa, Save-Our-Shores Executive Director, stated that she has seen an increase in the use of reusable bags with no increase in the use of paper bags and presented reasons to support the proposed Ordinance.

Tim Goncharoff, Santa Cruz County Integrated Waste Management Programs Coordinator, stated that the County has received an excellent response to the County's new ordinance to reduce single-use plastic and paper carryout bags.
