



NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING BEFORE THE CAPITOLA CITY COUNCIL

SUBMITTAL OF THE STATE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) APPLICATION – FISCAL YEAR 2014/2015

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City of Capitola will conduct a public hearing on March 27, 2014, at 7:00 pm at Capitola City Hall, 420 Capitola Avenue, Capitola, CA 95010, in order to discuss the submittal of an application to the Fiscal Year 2014/2015 State Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program and to solicit citizen input on possible activities to be included in these applications.

Eligible activities in the Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) consist of: Homeownership Assistance and Housing Rehabilitation Programs; Public Facility and Public Improvement Projects (including Public Improvements in Support of New Housing Construction); Public Service Programs, Planning Studies, Economic Development Business Assistance and Microenterprise Activities. Eligible activities paid for with State CDBG funds must meet one or more of the three national objectives listed in CDBG federal statutes as follows: Benefit to low income households or persons; elimination of slums and blight; or meeting urgent community development need.

The City of Capitola is applying for \$1 million under this NOFA for the following activities and amounts:

- Homeownership Assistance and Housing Rehabilitation Combo Program (\$1 Million)

The purpose of this public hearing will be to give citizens an opportunity to make their comments known on the proposed application.
