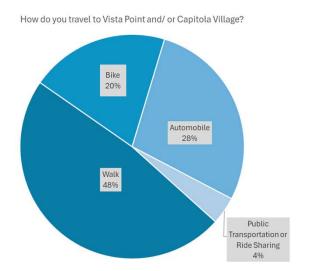


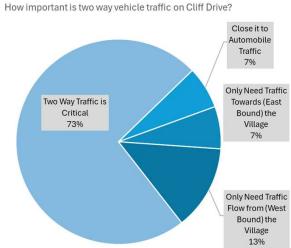

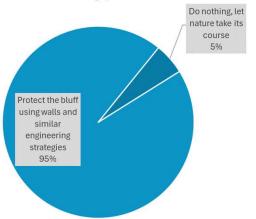


### Community Feedback





The bluff supporting Cliff Drive is threatened by erosion. If the City can reasonably attain funding, we should do one of the following options.



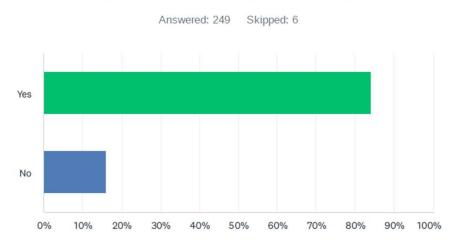




### August 2024 Survey – 255 Responses

Q7 Do you support continued efforts to protect Cliff Drive from further bluff

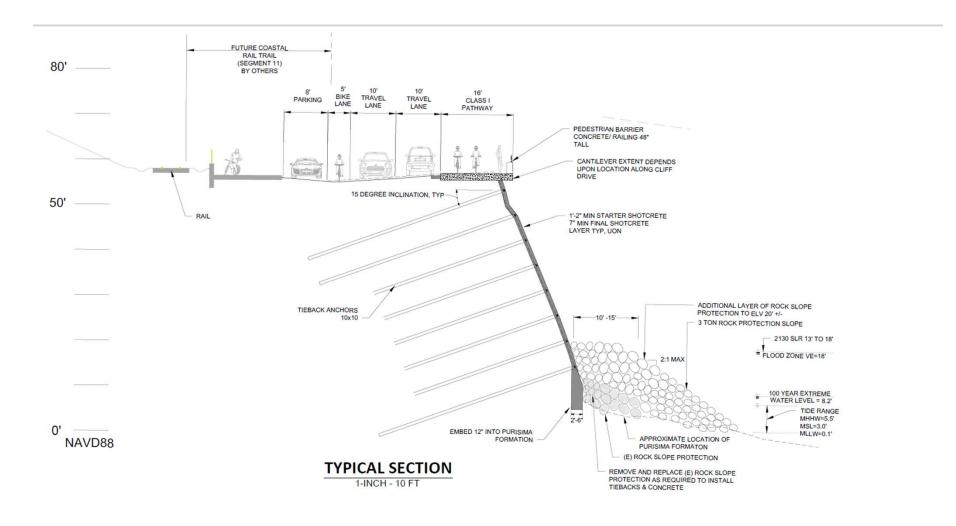

# What is the Local Coastal Program (LCP)?

The guiding policy and regulatory framework for development and resource protection within the City's coastal zone.





#### 2 Key Components

#### Land Use Plan (LUP):

Establishes broad policies for land use, coastal access, habitat protection, and hazard management.

#### Implementation Plan (IP):

Contains the specific zoning standards, ordinances, and procedures to carry out the LUP policies.

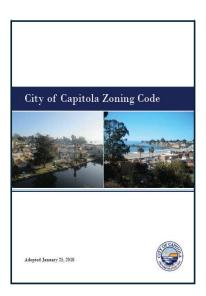
#### Land Use Plan

City of Capitola

Local Coastal Program

Certified by the California Coastal Commission June, 1981 December, 1981

Revised and Updated to Include Amendments October, 2001 January 2005 (CAP-MAJ-2-04)





#### Why do we have to update the LCP?

- 1. Outdated Policies: The current LCP was certified in 1981, with only one limited update in 2005,
- 2. Resilience Planning: To address increased coastal erosion, sea-level rise, and public access needs, Capitola must align its policies with current science and best practices.
- 3. Funding Requirement: Cliff Drive Resiliency Project received grant funding from the Coastal Commission. Updating the LCP is a condition of that grant.
