Reducing Use of Non-Biodegradables for a Cleaner Capitola

Polystyrene packaging and plastic bags either end up in landfills or in the natural environment. The City of Capitola has implemented programs to help reduce the use of and reliance on these non-biodegradable disposable products.

In 2006, the City of Capitola adopted an ordinance to help reduce the amount of non-biodegradable products being used in the City. The ordinance prohibits eateries from providing prepared food to customers in disposable containers that use polystyrene foam. It also requires disposable food service items to be biodegradable or compostable.

In 2013, the City of Capitola adopted an ordinance to help eliminate the use of plastic single-use carryout bags, encourage the use of reusable bags by consumers and retailers, and to reduce the consumption of single-use bags in general. The ordinance prohibits retail establishments from providing single-use plastic bags and requires a charge for paper bags.

ONLY RAIN DOWN THE STORM DRAIN

In Capitola we are incredibly lucky to live next to the Pacific Ocean and to have Soquel Creek run through the middle of our City. These resources are used and appreciated by many people for all sorts of activities. The next time you are able to appreciate the beauty of our environment, please take a moment to consider how we can all help keep it that way.

In Capitola, our water goes two places:

Inside our homes and businesses, it goes down the drain. This water goes to the wastewater treatment plant, so it can be soapy, dirty, or contain human waste without harming the environment. The water is treated, and reused to irrigate landscape.

Outside, water goes down a storm drain, or down a drainage ditch. Only rain should go in the storm drain! Storm drains flow directly to our creeks and rivers, and eventually the ocean, without treatment.

Trash and debris are the most frequent culprits polluting our waterways. Trash and solids on streets eventually make their way into our creeks and rivers. Even organic debris can plug up storm drains below the street, causing overflow and flooding. Always pick up debris and trash rather than sweeping or hosing them off your property. With El Niño in the forecast, it's especially important to prepare for the onslaught by keeping gutters, sidewalks, storm drains and streets clear of debris.

Carwash and pressure washing water can be very dirty and pollute creeks. Redirect this water to landscaping or a sanitary sewer cleanout.

Thank you for your help to protect our creeks and ocean. Be proud that you take part in protecting the beauty of our City.
